Costs: *There are no costs to the students for participation in this camp. Students will be housed in one of the dormitories on campus and meals will be provided.*

Transportation: *Transportation will be provided to and from the camp location from BBCF office located in Selma, AL.*

Requirements:

- ***Student must be entering 9th grade at the end of this school year or entering 12th***
- ***Must attend a school in one of the 12 counties of the Black Belt Region***
- ***Submit a one-page creative writing essay on the topic "What is your legacy?"***
